Tree Improvement Program Malaysian teak clones: growth, form and wood properties assessment



The oldest genetic trial in KVTC's highest productivity site, compartment D120a reached 20-year rotation and was clearfelled in October/November 2024. This is one of the two clonal trials on two sites with con trasting productivity containing 10 of the clones origi nating from Solomon Islands (known as Malaysian clones) and a Tanzanian seed lot as a control.

It was of interest to gather adequate information not only on tree growth performance and form through a series of measurements and assessments during its life but also on desired wood properties of the final wood produced.

A sampling strategy was designed, where for each clone, 10 trees were selected and suitable boards were extracted from each of the butt logs (2.3 metres long) for Wood

Properties Assessment. The following Wood Proper ties were deemed important for KVTC and its clientele:



- 1. Basic Wood Density
- 2.Static Bending: Modulus of Elasticity (MOE), Modulus of Rupture (MOR), Work to Maximum Load
- 3. Wood workability
- 4. Nail withdrawal
- 5. Heartwood colour

The Lab work is still being conducted at Sokoine Uni versity of Agriculture, College of Forestry, Wildlife and Tourism under the Department of Forest Engi neering and Wood Sciences through an existing MOU with the College. The rationale of the previous series of growth measurements and assessments and the current Lab work is to explore breeding opportunities for a combination of optimal growth, form, and the selected wood properties.

A similar study will be conducted with clones from the contrasting productivity trial site in compartment D111. This will be clear-felled later this year. The goal is to conclude the study and provide a list of recommended clones for appropriate commercial deployment. by Jeremiah Gumadi
